¹ The male was ringed on 16 May 2014 at St George's Church, Sheffield. He was in juvenile plumage when he bred for the first time.

² TAA fell from a nest high in the KC Stadium at Hull. He could not be returned to a place near the nest, so a decision was taken to relocate him. After consultation with the relevant parties involved in the rescue, it was decided that the Wakefield peregrines could take on an extra chick. Natural England gave the necessary permission for the action, and TAA was put on the walkway at the top of the tower, close to the nestbox on 14 June 2018. TAA successfully fledged, along with the three Wakefield juveniles. On 23 May 2019 TAA was found trapped in a building in Leeds city centre. He was released fit and well.
